

Memorandum on the Second Russian-Indian Network Universities Meeting (October, 4 - 10, 2017 Moscow - Tomsk)

National Research Tomsk state university as the Coordinator of the Russian-Indian Network (RIN) from the Russian side together with Moscow state university by M.V. Lomonosov and Indian Institute of Technology Bombay with the assistance and support of the Embassy of the Republic of India in the Russian Federation initiated the organization of the Second Russian-Indian Network Universities Meeting in autumn 2017.

The Second Russian-Indian Network Universities Meeting marked the 70th anniversary of the diplomatic relations between the Republic of India and the Russian Federation. As a result, the Meeting was held at Moscow state university by M.V. Lomonosov (October, 4-7) and at Tomsk state university (October, 8-10).

The Meeting was aimed at establishing direct contacts among researchers and relevant managers in order to promote cooperation development among the universities of Russian and India for strengthening their educational, scientific and cultural interaction. In addition, it was pointed at seeking the opportunity for discussing further Russian-Indian cooperation in the spheres of education, science and technologies.

The participants of the Second RIN Meeting got the opportunity to familiarize not only with the leading universities of Moscow and Saint-Petersburg but also with the universities of the Asian part of Russia. Therefore, holding the Meeting in two different parts of Russia - the European and the Asian ones - gain special meaning. The universities of Moscow and Saint-Petersburg are well-known around the world and occupy rather high positions in international universities' rankings. The universities of the Asian part of Russia are less known abroad; however, they possess huge potential for mutually beneficial cooperation. For instance, Tomsk state university occupies 323rd position in QS University Ranking 2017, Novosibirsk state technical university is included in Times Higher Education BRICS and Emerging Economies Rankings.

Representatives of almost all Russian RIN members took part in the Second Russian-Indian Network Universities Meeting.

During the Second RIN Meeting the participants familiarized with the achievements and the level of International Relations development at the universities - RIN members as well as visited a number of Russian universities including Peoples' Friendship University of Russia, Moscow Institute of Physics and Technology, National University of Science and Technology MISiS, Moscow State University by M.V. Lomonosov, National Research Tomsk State University, National Research Tomsk Polytechnic University, Tomsk State University of Control Systems and Radioelectronics and Siberian State Medical University.

The representatives of the Embassy of the Republic of India in the Russian Federation also took part in the Second Russian-Indian Network Universities Meeting. In particular, the Ambassador of India, His Excellence Mr Pankaj Saran took part in the Moscow part of the Meeting. Deputy Chief of Mission Mr Balasubramanian Gangadharan and Counselor for Science and Technology Mr Saurabh Kumar took part in Tomsk part of the Meeting.

During the Second Russian-Indian Network Meeting the following decisions were taken:

- the Statute of the Russian-Indian Network was initialed by approbation of all the representatives of the RIN members present. Afterwards the Statute should be sent to all the Rectors of the RIN Members for the signature;
- it was offered to make a list of research spheres cooperation in which may be mutually beneficial for both sides. In particular, a number of such research spheres was outlined including Big Data, Detectors and Sensors, Energy, Smart materials, Urban planning and development, Climate change and Environmental Protection4
- it was decided to promote the creation of a number of joint research groups (from 1 to 5) that could hold their meetings approximately in March May of the following year. The representatives of Indian RIN members offered to hold such meetings at their universities (IIT Delhi and IIT Hyderabad);
- it was suggested that there is urgent need to bring to the notice the need for creating the fund for financing joint research projects in addition to the active involvement of existing financial instruments for academic mobility and research support from both Russian and Indian sides;

- the opportunity of holding a large-scale scientific event during the following year was discussed:
- the idea of holding one joint educational event devoted to the personalization of higher education and new technologies in education was expressed;
- it was offered to announce joining of the RIN conditional on the availability of the applying university to contribute effectively to the development of Russian-Indian relations in the spheres of higher education, science and technologies. Therefore, it was suggested that the relevant procedure should be elaborated;
- 5 applications were submitted by Russian universities for joining Russian-Indian Network that will be then assessed and approved after the establishment of the relevant procedure;
- the attention of the participants was drawn to the fact that the persons responsible for the maintenance of the RIN official web-site from both Russian and Indian sides should be appointed;
- it was offered to hold the Third Russian-Indian Network Meeting the next year in one of the Indian Institutes of Technology;

In conclusion, the participants of the Meeting expressed their gratitude to the Russian side for the organization of the event and expressed their wish to proceed with the cooperation within the Russian-Indian Network.
